
ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

Material: Salvaged birdcage, tie wire Dimensions: 150h x 100w x 50d cm

This work, titled from a 1890s Henry Lawson poem, reimagines the dresses of women of the era gaoled for offences like 'vagrancy' or 'no visible means of support' in black cage material referencing the uncomfortable dresses worn in prison; each is different but nevertheless a cage.

Title: **Taken from Country** Price: \$30,000

Material: Metal neck collars and padlocks, leather saddle

and halter, metal chain

Dimensions: 210h x 70w x 800d cm

All Aborigines from Sydney onwards, are to be made prisoners of war. If they resist, they are to be shot and their bodies hung from trees in the most conspicuous places near where they fall, so as to strike terror into the hearts of the surviving natives. Governor Macquarie – Orders 1816.




002 ALYSON HAYES - Lindfield, NSW

Light represents the primordial essence and interconnectedness of all life. By illuminating nature, its most intimate secrets are revealed; its patterns, textures and intricacies. Reminiscent of cells, forms in nature, ecosystems, universes, microcosm and macrocosm, the sculptures are uniquely interpreted by the viewer connecting them with their own Nature memories.

mild stee


Dimensions: 177h x 78w x 24d cm

Inspiration can come from many sources, such as nature. Emerging is inspired by the interactions between the botanical and fauna.





This three-piece installation aims to highlight our dependence on nature. Seedpods are the receptacles that contain and protect seeds. Without seeds life on earth would not be possible.

Title: Temporal Flux Price: \$16,000 Material: Ceramics, white raku clay, paint, scoria stone

Dimensions: 50h x 4000w x 6000d cm

Temporal Flux reflects on our place within nature as spiritual, biological and technological organisms. A large scale ceramic sculpture emerges from the landscape and recedes into the earth. Pondering the alternating experience of belonging and separation and embodying an attempt to reconcile and sooth the tension of living between worlds.



013 HARRIE FASHER - Portland, NSW

Title: Voices at Dawn Price: \$24,000

Material: Bronze, steel, concrete Dimensions: 250h x 115w x 115d cm

Voices at Dawn stands between figuration and abstraction. A bronze female bust is held aloft by an abstract arrangement of steel and concrete line and volume. Derived from the central woman in the mythology surrounding the Morai and our mortality, her role is open for interpretation.




010 MARGARITA SAMPSON - Blackheath, NSW

An abstract sculpture with shapes and forms with marble inlays. Sometimes this sculpture is referred to as Escargot.

Material: Carved stringybark Dimensions: 256h x 35w x 30d cm

Timber is a focussed material. It goes in one direction but abrupt change can make it uncomfortable and insecure. The zigs and zags harass the grain however maintain its structural integrity throughout these contortions.

The title tells it all.

'Guardian Angel'. When you look up you know they are there, looking over you, protecting you and guiding you through life.

Title: The Little Black...Angel In Disguise Price: \$2,900 Material: Polyester/Spandex/Lace, rigilene boning, feathers, wood, glass, metal, fibreglass, enamel paint Dimensions: 141h x 51w x 51d cm

Fabric can create sculptural forms that transcend fashion. The iconic 'LBD' is levitated, vet still evoking desire and admiration and left to wonder "which shoes to wear"!?

Title: Closest Follower Price: \$14,000

Material: Painted cast iron, polished stainless steel, painted steel, corten steel

Dimensions: 180h x 32w x 55d cm

The shaped void in this work replaces what would normally be a reflection. In a sense this contrary state of the reflection/void/shadow allows the figure to 'reflect' on what an image of itself might be. The figure also sees its silhouetted shadow beyond the void.

Material: A kinetic sculpture. Recycled timber, steel Dimensions: 380h x 550w x 550d cm

Visualizing the lie of climbing to 'success'.

A mythical ladder flying in the air, just spinning in the breeze, is the story of rampant consumerism in the modern world that we have been sold.

Real joy, happiness, and contentment come from family, friends, and enjoying the life before us.



019 TANIA MCMURTRY - Roseville, NSW

Title: The Shadow Lines Price: \$8,765 Material: Australian recycled hard wood, mild steel

Dimensions: 208h x 158w x 340d cm

McMurtry's sculpture speaks to her earliest recollections of growing up in N.Ireland - of trauma and dislocation by human means - infusing her work with an emotional potency. It manifests as a passage and a barrier, the dichotomy of which represents a visceral tension truly experienced whilst wholly within the space.

Title: Waves of Change

Material: Ceramic, wood

Dimensions: 26h x 32w x 28d cm

Chain reactions start by small actions - on streets, in neighbourhoods, on social media. They can snowball and form part of a large collective action. Just as butterfly wings beating in the jungle can create chaos, so a ripple can give rise to huge global waves of political change.

In this sculpture I have strived to capture the natural appearance of lines in nature as opposed to a mathematical or geometric process. The sculpture is created from a redgum burl and is of one solid piece. There may be the initial illusion this is made up of multiple segments.




Title: **Woman on a balloon**Price: \$120,000

Who wins? It's your move.




